## When You See God Clearly

Isaiah 6:1–8

**Big Idea:** When we see God clearly, it changes how we see our fears, our sin, our future, and our purpose.

### 1. Remember who is on the throne

#### Isaiah 6:1–4

- King Uzziah died, but God was still on the throne.
- Earthly leadership changes. God does not.
- In uncertainty, we can trust our Heavenly Father.

**Key thought:** God is still in control.

**Prayer:** *Father, help me trust You are in control.*

### 2. The closer you are to God, the more you realize your need for grace

#### Isaiah 6:5

- Isaiah sees God’s holiness and becomes aware of his sin.
- We all need grace.
- People who know they need grace tend to extend grace.

**Key thought:** Awareness of God’s holiness reveals our need for mercy.

**Prayer:** *Father, thank You for Your grace. Help me extend it to others.*

### 3. Don’t limit God

#### Isaiah 6:6–7

- God removes Isaiah’s guilt and forgives his sin.
- No one is too far gone for God’s grace.
- God can forgive, restore, and use broken people.

**Key thought:** God is able to make you clean and new.

**Prayer:** *Father, I receive Your forgiveness. Help me live as Your new creation.*

#### 4. God's inward grace leads to outward obedience

##### Isaiah 6:8

- Grace leads Isaiah to surrender: "Here I am. Send me."
- God's forgiveness is not just for comfort, but for calling.
- We are sent into our homes, workplaces, schools, and neighborhoods.

**Key thought:** Grace received should lead to obedience and mission.

**Prayer:** *Here I am, Lord. Send me.*

#### Deep Dive Questions:

1. Where in your life do you need to remember that God is still on the throne?
2. When was the last time you became aware of your need for God's grace?
3. What might it look like for you to say "Here I am, send me" this week?
